

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The UAE is a centrally located regional hub with world class infrastructure. More than 206 nationalities reside here, which means the influx of digital information into the country can come from anywhere around the world. According to recent statistics the UAE has world's second highest internet penetration at 92% with over 8.8 million residents now online. The country also tops the region in smartphone user penetration at 64.6%.

The UAE has always been a frontrunner in championing the issues related to child protection and online abuse. The Ministry of Interior's Child Protection Center launched an awareness campaign this April, with the slogan "Together to Prevent Child Abuse". This November, they also joined forces with the Virtual Global Taskforce (VGT) which is an international alliance of law enforcement agencies and private sector partners dedicated to combating online child sexual abuse.

Some of the long-terms goals and initiatives of the government of UAE, like the Vision 2021, reflect their visionary approach to develop and advance human society. It provides platforms that are aligned with the project strategy and goals that are embedded in the proposed program.



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

## The Birth of an NGO





Every NGO is formed to address a social issue.eSafe (Emirates Safer Internet) Society has been formed to protect children online and to empower them to make informed decisions about their use of computers, online chat rooms and social media.

This initiative began when we learned about online child abuse and the absence of protective measures in the region. The team communicated with international agencies such as UNICEF, ITU and INTERPOL to find the best practices in this regard. The result was an invitation to Europe and USA for an Expert Exchange Program. During this trip, the team visited more than seven countries and 25 organizations working in the field of child online protection. Right after the trip, the process of establishing an NGO was initiated. A group of 35 highly inspired UAE nationals joined as founding members and put forward the registration request to the Ministry of Community development. In October-2015 the team received the approval to form this NGO.

#### The Problem to Address.

The first thing eSafe has done is to conduct a situation analysis and mapping exercise to understand the on-the-ground reality of child abuse issues online. A world-class strategic consulting firm (The Palladium Consulting) voluntarily come forward to support eSafe for this exercise. During the program, the team have identified the following strategic threats online for children - Child Sex Predators, Cyber Bullying/ Blackmailing, Access to Inappropriate Content, Child Sexual Abuse Material, Terrorism, Cyber Scams/Phishing, Child Self-Generated Sexual Content, and Electronic Addictions.

#### **International Best Practices**

eSafe has been blessed with the complete 'know-how' on this issue offered by the International organizations and developed nations with whom we have been consulting. Many best practices have already been suggested to the UAE government and to the educational institutions in terms of strategy, contents and modus operandi.

#### **All about Education**

We strongly recommend awareness and education of Teachers, Parents and Children as essentials to tackle the issues related to children online. The key solution to all of these issues is building resilience through education, as blocks and restrictions are not the way forward. Various impact-based and measurable education programs are planned to deliver the message to a mass audience of students from a wide age range, parents, teachers and authorities.

#### **Our Vision**

Our vision set in the Strategy Map is "To be a sustainable and globally recognized hub for child online protection by 2021". "Sustainability" is very challenging. We can't only depend on private or government funding.

Therefore, eSafe is establishing its own sustainability plan by providing professional services to schools, corporations and governments on a revenue model. The revenue will be used to fund the cause and the organization. The success of this model will become an international benchmark for sustainable "Social Entrepreneurship".

A Mass membership campaign, School & Corporate memberships, Training & Consulting services are the few revenue streams which eSafe is currently working on.

#### **Strategic Partnership**


eSafe's philosophy is to establish partnerships with companies on a common ground. The society collaborated with Tachyon IT Consultancy company to establish networking within schools in the UAE. Tachyon is a service provider to 120 schools in UAE. The eSafety Newsletter and eSafety School membership is a result of this partnership.

# Gaming Addiction Classified as a Disorder

A Recently Classified Disorder has been Identified that Threatens our Children's Development and it can be in Every Home.

Figure 1. The proportion of the UK population who play games on one or more platforms, by age group and gender.



Platforms include: smart phones, portable devices, PCs, consoles, social networks and web browser games. The active gamer category includes games bought from a shop, or by digitally downloading its equivalent.



The number of electronic devices that can be used for gaming is on the rise. Most houses these days have multiple mobile phones, tablets, laptops, gaming consoles, and computers, which all can be used for gaming.

Children are more interested in spending time behind a screen than doing any other activity and will happily spend hours and hours on gaming without stopping, or taking a break, if given the chance.

According to Han, S. (2012) "The advance in mobile technologies and the proliferation of Smartphones have increased the opportunity to game and thus made video game addiction one of the fastest growing types of addiction. Video game addiction has profound influence on our children's behavioral and psychological development"

In 2018, the World Health Organization classified gaming as a disorder, stating that: "Gaming disorder is defined in the 11th Revision of the International Classification of Diseases (ICD-11) as a pattern of gaming behaviour ("digital-gaming "or " video-gaming") characterized by impaired control over gaming, increasing priority given to gaming over other activities to the extent that gaming takes precedence over other interests and daily activities, and continuation or escalation of gaming despite the occurrence of negative consequences".


However, people should be alert to the amount of time they spend on gaming, as well as to any changes in their physical or psychological health and social functioning that could be attributed to their pattern of gaming behavior, as not all gamers are classified as addicts.



## **Child Online Protection in UAE**

Your Child's Safety might be in Jeopardy even in the Comfort of your own Home. Help us to Spread Awareness on the Potential Online Dangers.



Child Online Protection (COP) is an initiative established by the International Telecommunication Union in November 2008, supported by the United Nations Secretary - General, states and several international organizations.

COP is a project to protect children worldwide against cyber threats by providing legal, technical and organizational measures.

United Arab Emirates - being the pioneers of change and development in the Middle East - have maximized their efforts on both national and international levels to create a safe online platform for children.

On the International level, UAE hosted many summits such as VGT and #weprotect global summit and was awarded a permanent seat on the #WePROTECT Global Alliance International Advisory Board (IAB), in recognition of its security and police work in the field of child protection.

In June 2017, the UAE was elected to lead the international committee for Child Online Protection (COP) during the International Telecommunication Union (ITU) Conference in Geneva.


On the National level, the UAE government has issued several laws which guarantee the protection of children from all forms of exploitation and abuse under articles 29 and 37. In addition, a joint initiative was established between Aqdar Khalifa Empowerment Program for Students. This government program for students' empowerment and awareness works alongside the Emirates Safer Internet Society (E-safe), a foundation for a safer online experience in the UAE, with a key focus on children. The joint initiative organized the safer internet day 2017, which reached more than 10,000 students across the country, in a vast campaign to raise awareness about internet safety.

Further, The Regulatory Authority (TRA) has established a Computer Emergency Response Team, which aims to support a safe cyber environment for the residents of the UAE. They also created SALIM, an Emirati character acting as a cybersecurity adviser, who provides tips to internet users on how to protect themselves against cyber threats, and by doing so guides them towards a safe cyber culture.

During the opening ceremony, Lt. General HH Sheikh Saif bin Zayed Al Nahyan, Deputy Prime Minister and Minister of Interior said: "We are gathered here today under the umbrella of peace, coexistence and tolerance, an approach that was inspired by the ideology, legacy and directives of the late Sheikh Zayed and the teachings of Islam. This approach is also supported by the UAE's wise leaders, along with nations and people from around the world, who join efforts to consolidate these morals and uphold the values of justice, tolerance and love."

Interfaith dialogue is defined as an exchanges among religious practitioners and communities on matters of doctrine and issues of mutual concern in culture and politics. They explore the world's religious traditions in their efforts to collaborate on questions of peace, social development and how an interfaith dialogue can help the community to prevent Online Exploitation of children.

According to the Khaleej Times (2018) the authorities at the Ministry of Interior (MoI) stated: "The UAE will sign the Abu Dhabi Declaration to protect children from abuse and sexual assault online". In order to fight off crimes against children online, the UAE

Government stated in the Khaleej Times, that it will be hosting its first 'Interfaith Alliance for Safer Communities: Child Dignity Online' forum, bringing together the world's religious leaders to tackle the world's most pressing social challenges. In addition, as stated by Gulf News (2018) it was reported that "Religious scholars and experts in cybercrimes against children and their sexual exploitation will gather in Abu Dhabi to find solutions for safer communities and protection of children".

Statistics show that millions of children and adolescents are exposed to criminal behavior online every year as the issue of child abuse and exploitation on the Internet is more than just a concern.

Experts in child protection believe that religious leaders impact the minds of people; therefore, they have an important role to play in the protections of families, adolescents and children. They are supposed to protect them from being exploited in all aspects of life – now including online - which is one of the biggest threats to children today.
